- Case summary must be included background, medical history, clinical diagnosis, therapeutic management clinical out cone and conclusion
- SHOULD BE SUBMITTED ONLY BY ONLINE MODE THROUGH icvd3goareg@gmail.com
- Organizing committee reserves rights to accept/reject the abstract
- Abstract will be accepted only after the payment for Symposium
- Poster presentation should be printed in biodegradable materials with the size of 2ft (vertical X 3ft (Horizontal) including borders
- Three minutes for Presentation and Two minutes for discussion. Number of slides

CASE CONFERENCE GUIDELINES

- Dermatological case must be unique. Includes known/ gold standard diagnosis with clinical management
- Only one case study is accepted for presentation. If more than one cases are combined, it will be allowed in research communication abstract sessions.
- Coauthors must be restricted to five.
- Co authors will be issued symposium participation certificate only after the payment of eligible symposium registration fees.
- Case summary must be included as background, medical history, clinical diagnosis, therapeutic management clinical outcome and conclusion
- SHOULD BE SUBMITTED ONLY BY ONLINE MODE THROUGH icvd3goareg@gmail.com
- Cases must be handled in last one year as on 31.03.2024
- It is mandatory to provide mobile number, email id and presentation slides on or before 31.03.2024
- Case summary will be accepted only after the payment of symposium registration
- Only Post graduate students and field practitioners are eligible for case conference presentation
- Post graduate students should get authorization certificate (available in website) from the concern Head of the department and submit scanned copy along with abstract.
- Field practitioners should submit Self declaration form (available in website)/undertakingformalong with the abstract
- Case Presentation should be prepared in MS Powerpoint (not earlier than 2007) with 25 MB file Size only Three minutes for Presentation and Two minutes for discussion with ten slides only. Extra time presentation attracts negative marks

PROFILE OF CVE EXPERTS



Prof. Dr. SHEILA M.F. TORRES

Professor of Veterinary Dermatology, College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Minnes

Dr. Torres graduated from veterinary school in 1979 at the Federal University of Veterinary Medicine of Minas Gerais in Brazil. She obtained a Master degree at the same Institution in 1982 and was hired as Assistant Professor where she worked from 1982 through 1992. In 1990 Dr. Torres obtained a PhD and completed a residency in veterinary dermatology at the University of Minnesota, College of Veterinary Medicine in 1990, USA. In 1993 she returned to the University of Minnesota as an Assistant Clinical Specialist and became board certified by the American College of Veterinary Dermatology in 1994. She is currently the Dermatology Section Chief and Full Professor with tenure at the College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Minnesota. Dr. Torres is also the vice chair for education at the same institution. She is the author or co-author of more than 50 peer-reviewed original articles. Dr. Torres is the co-author of a canine and feline dermatology drug handbook and has written 16 book chapters. She is currently working on an electronic book in small and large animal dermatology. Dr. Torres areas of research interest are canine atopic dermatitis and alternatives to conventional antibiotic therapy



Prof. Dr. ROSANNA MARSELLA

Professor, Small Animal Clinical Sciences College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Florida, USA

Dr Marsella is a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Dermatology and full Professor at the University of Florida. She has served as co-editor for Veterinary Dermatology and is a member of the Task Force on Canine Atopic Dermatitis. She also co-edited the current BSAVA Dermatology Manual.Dr. Marsella is a graduate of the University of Milano (Italy, 1991). After graduation, Dr. Marsella worked in private practice for a couple of years and then decided to pursue specialty training in dermatology. Dr. Marsella became a board certified dermatologist in 1996 and has been a faculty member at the University of Florida since 1997.Dr Marsella has authored more than 150 peer-reviewed articles and has written several books (Manual of Equine Dermatology and Clinical Approach to Feline Dermatologic Diseases) and contributed to many others as either author or author and editor (e.g., BSAVA Manual of Canine and Feline Dermatology). She has served as president of the American College of Veterinary Dermatology and co-editor of Veterinary Dermatology.Dr. Marsella is a horse lover and owner and has a special interest in equine dermatology. She has extensively published in the area of equine allergies, their diagnosis and treatment.
